Clinical Training Locations



01

Student holds an active, non-restricted Canadian nursing license in the province they are doing clinical training. Nursing students are eligible to begin the Theory portion of the program, but cannot continue to the Clinical Training until they obtain their full, active license.

05

Student has completed all other pre-requisites, registration forms and payment as per the contract with their clinical training instructor.

02

Student must complete and submit certificate of completion for the Theory, CSA:MDR, and IPAC Hand Hygiene courses before the first day of clinical training.

06

Student has signed the Foot Canada Training Code of Conduct contract provided by their clinical training instructor.

03

Student has minimum liability coverage as per their provincial nursing standard.

04

Student can communicate proficiently in English and has the computer skills necessary to complete an online course.

Admission Requirements

Students must provide proof and complete registration documents from the licensed education provider in their area before they are admitted to the program.

"Registration in the online Foot Care Nurse Theory course does not guarantee enrolment in the Clinical Training course.

Students are responsible for contacting the clinical educator in their area to confirm fees, dates, and wait times. Student enrolment is only guaranteed once registration or payment is completed. Training is scheduled at the discretion of the educator, and wait times may vary.



All students must be prepared to meet Canadian nursing standards, complete paperwork on time, and communicate safely with patients and their educator.

If readiness or safety concerns are identified, training may be delayed or rescheduled.



Educators maintain professional boundaries and respond to emails during business hours. Respectful communication is expected at all times; bullying, harassment, repeated cancellations, or unprofessional behaviour may result in dismissal.



Instruction and resources in the Theory Course and Clinical Training are provided in English.

For nurses for whom English is a second language, additional preparation or support hours may be recommended to ensure success and patient safety."
